ROTARY INFORMATION: A national monument honoring 20 leaders of major volunteer movements in the United States, including [Rotary founder Paul P. Harris](#), was unveiled in Washington, D.C., on 14 October.

Former President George Bush led the dedication ceremony for the Extra Mile-Points of Light Volunteer Pathway, a series of markers set along a mile long stretch of sidewalks near the White House and the U.S. Treasury Department.

"The Extra Mile will not only educate but inspire all those who walk its path," Bush said. "[It] should signal that greatness and goodness are not relegated to history books or confined to the existing monuments." Cokie Roberts, a political commentator, and Anthony Williams, the city's mayor, assisted at the event, which was attended by more than 500 people. Eunice Kennedy Shriver and Millard and Linda Fuller,

founders of the Special Olympics and Habitat for Humanity and the only living Extra Mile honorees, spoke at the ceremony.

The monument is marked by hand-sculpted bronze medallions embedded in granite and set into the sidewalk. Each medallion measures 42 inches in diameter and bears a bas-relief image of the honoree, a description of the volunteer's achievements, and a quotation.
