BOARD MEETING REPORT:

Report from Board of Directors Meeting -

1. Calendar - A draft version of a master calendar being developed by Rick Haverty has been distributed to board members. Updates should be made in a timely fashion.
2. Club Services Plan - The plan was approved and will be distributed to the members of the Club Services Committee by Bob Thompson.
3. Service Committees Leaders - The leader list was approved and will be distributed to all club members.
4. Evaluation of Pittsford Rotary Club - The Board agreed to form a five-member committee for the purpose of ongoing evaluation of the club and its events. The committee will review last years evaluation and make recommendations and conduct surveys as needed or requested by the Board. The President will appoint a chairperson.
5. Directory of Members – Birthdates and the year members joined Rotary will be added to our Directory of Members. Adding names of member's children was not passed.
6. Leadership Institute - A decision was made to have the club pay half of the registration fee for members who attend the Leadership Institute.
7. Honorary Members - Amy Coddington was made a paid Honorary Member and Doug Emblidge was made an Honorary Member. The other four Honorary Members are Ray Harley, Arnold Mackintosh, Janet Smith, and Marian Wilder.
8. Happy Dollars - It was agreed to continue to offer members an opportunity to give "Happy Dollars" at club meetings in place of fines.
9. Fund Raising - A five member committee will be formed with Fund Raising Chairperson, Ray Robbins, as the leader. The committee will study fund raising projects and develop a recommendation by September for the Board of Directors to consider. We need at least one new major event that supplements but doesn't conflict with our golf shamble or pancake supper fund raising projects.
10. Dictionary Project - A recommendation to evaluate the Dictionary Project was not approved. The Board approved the Dictionary Project in this year's budget for submission to the Foundation Board. It also approved a recommendation to send dictionaries to the sister school of St. Louis School in Kenya. The cost of 100 dictionaries and postage would be \$450. Please note that any charitable recommendations must pass the Foundation Board for funding approval.
11. Camp Haccamo – A motion to vote an opportunity for members to learn about Camp Haccamo during the evening of the picnic for the Fireman's Band was recinded. It was agreed that the plan should be discussed with the chairperson and that a vote was not required.

12. Budget - Input was requested before the Board meeting. The Board will vote on a proposed operating budget for the club at the August meeting. They will also vote on the proposed Foundation Budget and present it to the Foundation Board for their review in August.

President Haverty shared nine other follow-up items.
